Phrasal Verbs of the Month - April, 2024

A phrasal verb is a phrase that consists of a verb with a preposition or adverb or both, the meaning of which is different from the meaning of its separate parts.

Here are a few phrasal verbs for you. Read their meanings and use them judiciously.

- stand by : not take action when you should
  Ex: We can't just stand by and watch him suffer.
- stand by : to support
  Ex: A true friend will stand by you through thick and thin.
- 3. stand out : to be easy to be seen or noticed because of being different

Ex: His orange car stands out from all the rest.

4. stand out: to be much better or more important than something/ somebody

Ex: Her qualities make her stand out in a crowd.

- 5. strike at: to hitEx: He tried to strike at the snake to save himself.
- 6. strike off: to remove a name ( from rolls,etc.) Ex: His name was struck off the rolls due to long absence.
- 7. take after: to resembleEx: She takes after her mother.
- take away: to remove something
  Ex: Please take away these chairs. We don't need them anymore.
- take off: to remove
  Ex: You are expected to take off your shoes before entering the temple.
- take off: to fly
  Ex: The plane is about to take off.
