### Phrasal Verbs of the Month - April, 2024

*A phrasal verb is a phrase that consists of a verb with a preposition or adverb or both, the meaning of which is different from the meaning of its separate parts.*

*Here are a few phrasal verbs for you. Read their meanings and use them judiciously.*

- stand by : not take action when you should**  
**Ex: We can't just stand by and watch him suffer.**
- stand by : to support**  
**Ex: A true friend will stand by you through thick and thin.**
- stand out : to be easy to be seen or noticed because of being different**  
**Ex: His orange car stands out from all the rest .**
- stand out: to be much better or more important than something/ somebody**  
**Ex: Her qualities make her stand out in a crowd.**
- strike at: to hit**  
**Ex: He tried to strike at the snake to save himself.**
- strike off: to remove a name ( from rolls,etc.)**  
**Ex: His name was struck off the rolls due to long absence.**
- take after: to resemble**  
**Ex: She takes after her mother.**
- take away: to remove something**  
**Ex: Please take away these chairs. We don't need them anymore.**
- take off: to remove**  
**Ex: You are expected to take off your shoes before entering the temple.**
- take off: to fly**  
**Ex: The plane is about to take off.**
